#### **Review Ceremony**

The Review Ceremony is specifically held to honor the history of New Canaan Mounted Troop (“NCMT”) which was founded in 1939 as part of the Junior Cavalry of America. During the Ceremony, NCMT inducts new Troopers into the organization as its new “Cadets” and recognizes the hard work and dedication of all Troopers over the prior months. The Ceremony takes place twice a year in December and June. The June Ceremony is especially exciting because it’s during this Ceremony that we give out our Perpetual Trophies and Year End Awards. All Troopers and their parents are strongly encouraged to attend this event.

This year, the December Review Ceremony and Show mark the first Review Ceremony to be held in our new facility. This is a special and exciting time for NCMT to be shared with all!

Please keep in mind that Troopers must observe the Review Ceremony’s dress code (beige breeches or jodhpurs, NCMT jacket, riding boots) - there is no charge to participate in the Ceremony. Troopers participating in the Ceremony should arrive by 8:30 a.m. to pick up their uniform jacket for the Review Ceremony.

#### **Review Show**

The Review Horse Show immediately follows the Ceremony. The Show is open to any Trooper who wishes to participate and has received parent permission to do so. Show charges are posted on the sign-up board outside the office. There are appropriate classes for all riding abilities: we look forward to strong participation – it is a great and fun show!

We will also be offering **the NCMT Medal Class**. This class will give the Troopers who participate in the Children’s Equitation Division the unique opportunity to show against one and other, even though they may be jumping different fence heights (as is the case in several equitation classes offered at many horse shows). This class will include a test which will ask participants to exhibit additional skills that are not always demonstrated in a regular jumping course.
